The phenomenon of violent seizures and forced abandonment of land and territory in Colombia is just an element of a more complex situation in the process of territorial rearrangement by violent means, a reality that affects peasants as well as afro-descendent communities and indigenous peoples. This document presents a conceptual approach to the subject matter in the context of the Colombian armed conflict. Furthermore, it proposes a way to systematize and organize the information of memory, based on a typology that shows the variety of examples and methods that this text presents.

Imputation models and types of criminal offenses for *system crimes*: from a justice of imputation to a justice of representation

Amidst an armed conflict, Colombian judicial officers constantly face *system crimes* instead of isolated actions, that is, atrocities which have been articulated with collective agents in a determined context. Due to their particularities, prosecution of these crimes challenges regular understanding and application of the law. This manual's intent is to describe the criminal figures that lawyers deem relevant for their prosecution. The document is accompanied by a series of reflections on the role of judicial officers as memory gatherers of the Colombian conflict.
